1 Corinthians 11:23-34

Communion:

1. A group having a common religious faith.
2. An association or fellowship.
3. The act of sharing or holding in common with participation.

"The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? For we, though many, are one bread and one body; for we all partake of that one bread." 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

1. Partakers (vs. 23-25)

a. His CRUCIFIXION

"I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me".
Galatians 2:20

3 Views of the Lord's Supper:

Transubstantiation: Bread and wine turn into the body and blood

Consubstantiation: Christ's presence are within the bread and wine.

Memorial: Bread and wine are only symbols and contain no presence.

b. His COVENANT

"Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah—not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, though I was a husband to them, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people." Jeremiah 31:31-33

Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree", that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith." Galatians 3:13-14

POINT: All of the covenant promises of God are found in Christ.

3. Personal (vs. 27-29)

“Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my anxious thoughts; and see if there be any hurtful way in me, and lead me in the everlasting way.” Psalm 139:23-24

“Never mind that bread and wine, unless you can use them as folks often use their spectacles. What do they use them for? To look at? No to look through them. So, use the bread and wine as a pair of spectacles. Look through them, and do not be satisfied until you can say, “Yes, yes, I can see the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.” -Charles Spurgeon

4. Public (vs. 30-34)

“A little leaven leavens the whole lump.” Galatians 5:9

“Therefore if you bring your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar, and go your way. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift.” Matthew 5:23-24
